The Uxbridge Lions Club proposes to build an inclusive, accessible playground at Elgin Park because:

- * 12 15% of any population is identified as having a special need
- * Children learn to value inclusive attitudes when they play with their peers it builds kindness and confidence
- * Children who have access to play in a natural environment where they can play with their peers and family members, develop in all areas, cognitively, emotionally, physically and socially
- Our hope is to complete the playground by 2022 coming in with a cost of approximately \$300,000.





*Draft Budget Breakdown

Uxbridge - Elgin Park - Lions Club - Universally Accessible Playground



- * Total Budget \$300.000.00
- Preliminary site investigations, measurements (non-legal): \$3.000.00
- * Site hoarding, siltation controls, tree protection fencing, safety fencing: \$3,900.00
- * Demolition, removals, disposal: Currently offered by Town of Uxbridge
- * Grading, sub-drainage: \$4,500.00
- * Perimeter curbing/edging: \$18,800.00
- * Playground equipment (universally accessible) supply and install: \$160,000.00
- * Naturalized play elements: \$30,000.00
- * Safety surfacing: \$42,000.00
- * Walkways and connections to existing walkways: \$6,000.00
- * Restoration, shade tree planting: \$5,000.00
- * Third party CSA safety certification: \$800.00
- * Contingency: \$26,000.00

- *Appropriate and diverse ground cover
- *Accessibility to play experiences/equipment
- *Opportunities for nature exploration
- *Healthy risk taking opportunities
- *Opportunities for children with different abilities to play alongside each other

- *A place where Senses are engaged in different play experiences, i.e.: hearing, touching, smelling, seeing, kinesthetic, vestibular
- *Cooperative activities that promote social engagement and friendship
- *Play experiences that involve families in joyful companionship






Features



*Children need to climb to build muscle, spatial awareness and coordination.







*Climbing and Sliding



- * Children learn to move through space while they swing-developing their sense of motion and creating a different perspective of the world
- * While spinning, children's vestibular sense is challenged done in a group wonderful social experiences occur







* Swinging and Spinning

* Children develop an understanding of their world through pretend play - acting out familiar scenarios

* Exploring sound through instruments allows children of all abilities to feel sound vibrations and for most to hear interesting sounds.










* Pretend play and Music
